All books appearing in this BOOK LIST, and also all works appearing in PASS IN REVIEW and BOOKS RECEIVED, are rated on the basis of a five digit rating system. The five categories are:

**Presentation** - Quality of the illustrations, layout, text. A high rating would indicate that the work is about as well presented as it could possibly be.

**Style** - Quality of the writing and easiness of understanding.

**Information** - Quantity of hard information available, ease of access, reliability of data.

**Objectivity** - Degree of dispassionateness contained in the work.

**Overall** - An overall summary rating amounting to a recommendation.

These categories are rated numerically using numbers from 0 through 9 in this fashion: 8/9/7/8/8. A rating of "0" indicates that the work is virtually useless; "2", the work is poor; "4", of some value, but often flawed; "6", generally useful, with occasional flaws; "8", almost always of value. Intermediate ratings, those of "1"; "3"; "5"; "7"; and "9" indicate modifications of the basic ratings. Thus, "9" indicates a work of unusual value.

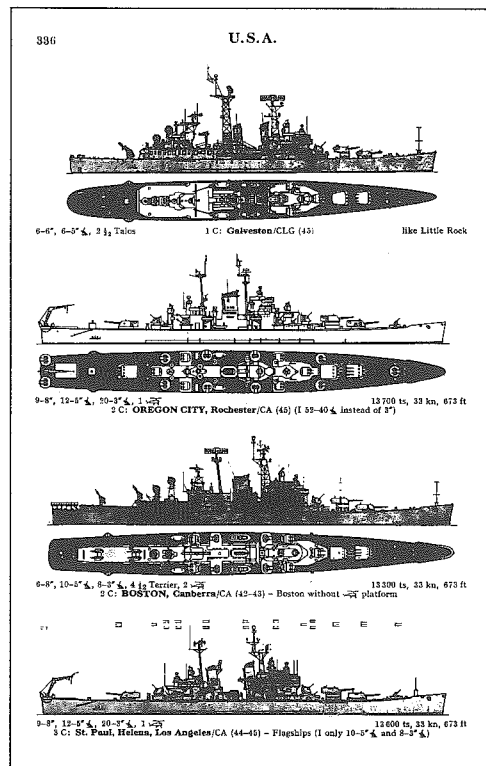

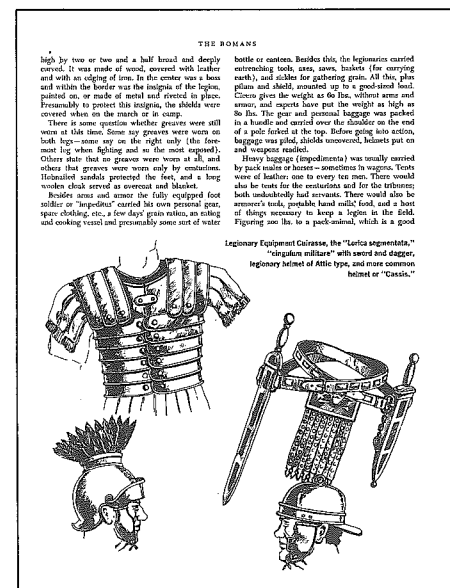

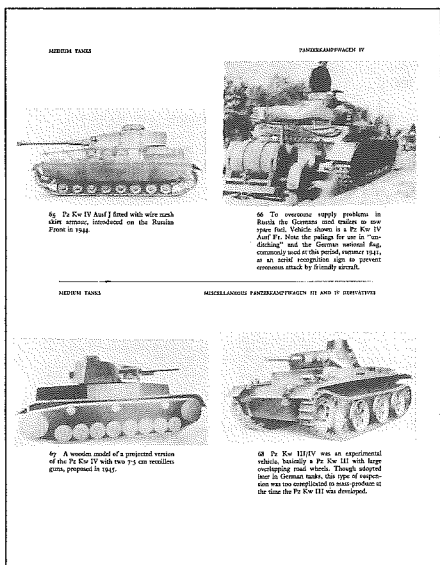

The Sheridan, whose design dates back to

1962, is to replace the M-41 and M-56 in the US Army. The first prototype, XM-551, was completed in 1962 and production vehicles started coming off the line in June 1966. It is produced at the Cleveland Tank Automotive Plant, owned by the Allison Division of General Motors. Technical direction of the program is in the hands of the Sheridan weapon systems project manager, located at the US Army Weapons Command at Rock Island, Illinois. The Sheridan incorporates many new developments, these include, aluminum engine, aluminum and magnesium 4 speed cross drive transmission, aluminum cross-flow radiator, 6,000 miles life gas tank, vehicle flotation screen (when raised the vehicle can float being propelled in the water by its tracks), forged aluminum hull. Perhaps the most important feature is the 152mm gun/launcher, this fires the Shillelagh surface-to-surface guided missile or at least three types of conventional ammunition. Other variants of the Sheridan are believed to be under development.  
**Employment**  
Used only by the United States Army, although the British and Australian Army have carried out trials with them. So far the vehicle has seen service in Vietnam where numerous short-comings have been found.

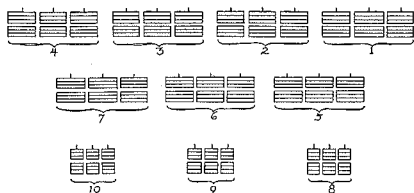

ity for these changes. In his efforts to retain political power he found it expedient to command troops who would not question a commander's motives. Sulla, Pompey and Caesar followed his example, and soon the patriotic citizen-soldier of Nero and Scipio had become only a memory.

## THE NEW ROMAN ORGANIZATION

It now grew as easy for the man of means to avoid serving as for the proletarian to make war his sole occupation. The relaxed standards led inevitably to tactics suited to a lower grade of human material. As the old distinctions between *triarii*, *principes* and *hastati* were abolished, the legion infantry consisted simply of light or heavy troops.

The former included foreign auxiliaries from Rome's new provinces—Ligurians, Balearic slingers and Numidian irregulars—instead of *velites* fighting their first campaigns. Only the heavy foot remained of solid Italian origin. The practice of combining a Roman with an Italian legion

fell into decline, and both classes of citizens mingled in the ranks as soldiers of fortune. Pay, loot, donatives and land grants combined to make the service so attractive that the average legionary had no thought of returning to civil life. He was no less a mercenary, despite his citizenship, than the alien in the light infantry or cavalry.

Gladiators were employed as drillmasters, for the new system did not neglect the training of the recruit. If possible, legionary discipline became even more severe with the lowering of admission standards, so that the extent of Roman public works may often be attributed to the need of occupation for a turbulent soldiery.

A detailed account of the German preparations for the invasion of Britain in 1940. The standard work on the subject. \$8.00

099. THE RUSSO-GERMAN WAR(A.Seaton)7/8/8/8/9.  
A very good account of the Second World War in Eastern Europe, but not for the novice. Contains a great deal of information and a number of insights not readily available elsewhere. \$15.00

100. BARBAROSSA: THE RUSSO-GERMAN CONFLICT(A.Clark)6/7/7/7/7. One of the better accounts of the Eastern Front. \$10.95

106. WAR AS I KNEW IT(G.S.Patton)6/8/8/7/8.  
Patton's personal memoirs of his military career along with a number of useful notes on tactics and troop care. \$6.95

109. THE ROMMEL PAPERS(B.H.Liddell Hart, ed.) 8/7/7/6/9. A collection from Rommel's diaries, notes, letters, and personal files giving a general, if one sided and somewhat inaccurate, account of his role in WW II. \$12.95

116. WHITE ENSIGN(S.W.Roskill)7/8/7/7/8. A good general account of Royal Navy operations in World War II, though somewhat inaccurate and incomplete. \$7.50

117. THE FRENCH NAVY IN WORLD WAR II(P.Auphan and J.Mordal)6/6/6/7/7. A very useful, well written and very complete account of French naval operations. Throws considerable light on numerous aspects of the war at sea. \$7.00

118. DER SEEKRIEG(F.Ruge)7/8/8/5/8. The German Navy's role in WW II. Very partisan, often inaccurate but invaluable for purely German aspects of the conflict. \$7.00

120. THE ITALIAN NAVY IN WORLD WAR II(M'A. Bragadin)8/8/8/7/8. A good, detailed account with a great deal of technical data but often weak in those areas where hard data would be most valuable. \$7.00

121. THE JAPANESE NAVY IN WORLD WAR II(R.O'Connor, ed.)7/8/7/6/8. A collection of essays by former Japanese officers. As such often uneven, but highly valuable as an essentially Japanese view of the Pacific War. \$7.50

128. ROMMEL, THE DESERT FOX(D.Young)7/8/6/5/7  
A good, but overly sympathetic biography of the German general rather weak in hard military data. \$5.95

129. THE PERSIAN EXPEDITION(Xenophon)6/8/8/7/9  
A good, careful translation of the ANABASIS, the attempt on the part of a Persian Prince to overthrow his brother with the aid of Greek mercenaries about 400 B.C. Very good insights into Greek military systems. \$1.65\*

130. THE PELOPONNESIAN WAR(Thucydides)8/8/9/9/9  
The standard account of the Great Atheno-Spartan War of the Fifth Century B.C. Considered the first true objective piece of history. \$1.95\*

A very good reference covering virtually all aspects of the war. Often surprisingly complete. Invaluable. \$4.95

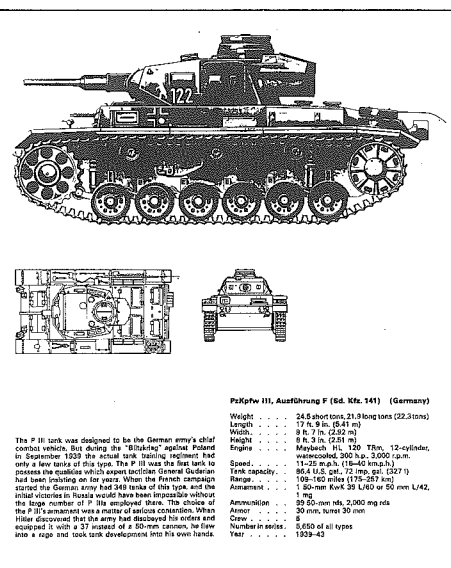

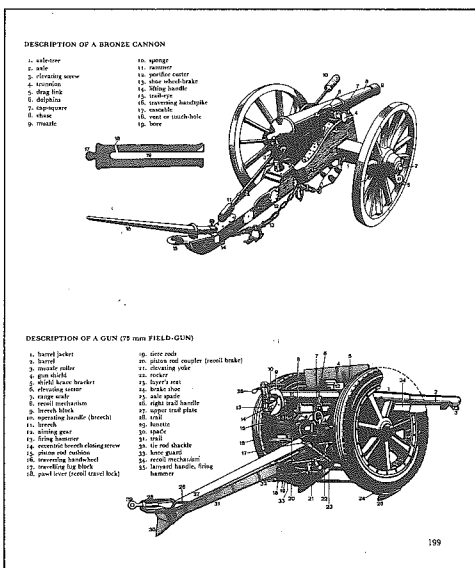
